### RESEARCH OVERVIEW

My program of research uses an interdisciplinary approach informed by both biobehavioral perspectives and classic social psychology to generate novel predictions about long-term relationship maintenance. One line of my research draws upon biobehavioral perspectives to generate novel predictions about individual differences underlying fundamental relationship motives and their implications for consequential relationship behaviors and outcomes, such as unprotected sex, partner standards, and divorce. A second line of my research examines how one particular environmental factor that alters women's physiology—hormonal contraceptives—impacts relationship processes.
